DigiCanTrain project (2023-2026) aims to upskill and reskill the health care workforce in the cancer care setting.

The results will improve access to continuing professional education, increase digital skills and the use of eHealth technology of clinical and non-clinical health care professionals working with people affected by cancer.

In the project, an education and training programme for trainers, clinical and non-clinical health care professionals is designed, piloted, and evaluated.

The education and training programme will include modules for trainers (train the trainers), multidisciplinary teams, nurses, oncology and general medicine specialists, non-clinical staff working in health systems and health authorities.

The modules will be designed to be adaptable to European cancer centres, and by different types of education providers.

The DigiCanTrain project will focus on

- identifying the existing training possibilities and the need for digital skills training for care professionals in oncology
- summarising the digital health tools and technologies especially used in communication, patient education and monitoring the impact of cancer treatment.
- identifying the most important competence areas to guide the development of DigiCanTrain programme curriculum and implementation plan
- creating and piloting the modules for the programme including theoretical and practical elements, and
- disseminating and sharing the results.
